Currently moving into its pilot period, it offers parents, teachers, schools, city-leaders and national policymakers the ability to better understand and promote the health and wellbeing of both themselves and their local communities and populations. In each case, it provides a quick and easy way to map and evaluate existing wellbeing scales and indicators that promote eco-systemic thinking and the need to 'measure what matters.'
