### SESSION TWO: PROGRESS AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

The second session will focus on using technology and progress for human development, rather than using humans for progress, which is the case of many school curricula around the world. the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) then, can be used as tools of implementation.
