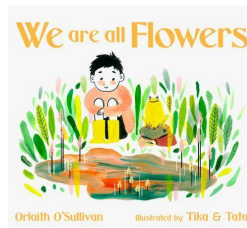

The Children's Charter for Compassion

The Children's Charter for Compassion is an organization based in Toronto, Canada. Founded and created by Erin Henry, mother of two, Max and Quinn, who at the time were just 7 and 4 years old. It was inspired by the original Charter for Compassion launched on November 12, 2009, worldwide by Karen Armstrong.

At the time there was very little heart and mind education which became Erin's purpose in composing the Children's Charter for Compassion for any and all who would benefit globally.

Its primary goal is to provide a means for children and those around them to understand how to treat themselves and others with love, kindness and ultimately with compassion. By implementing The Golden Rule, "do unto others as you will have done to yourself," world peace can be achieved. It begins with our children. Go to the Golden Rule events to see Max's and Quinn's interpretation of the Golden Rule thirteen years ago, and today. 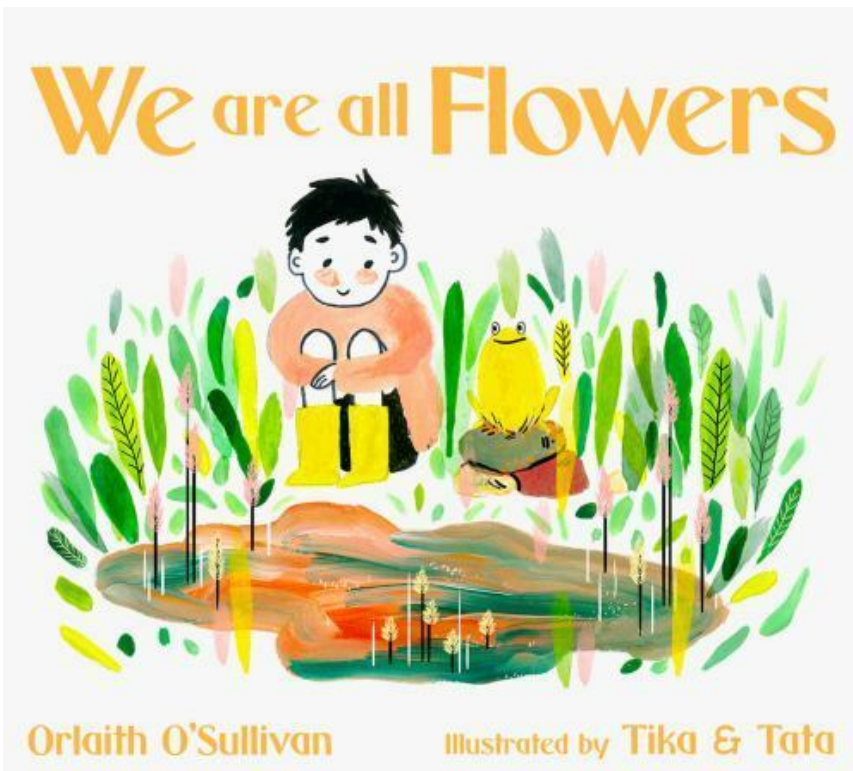
All Golden Rule events on April 5 are summarized on the Charter Website. In
